

Summary

Proposing an amendment to the constitution of the United States limits the number of terms a member of congress may serve and reaffirms that confederacies between the states are not allowed. Thereby increasing the pay rate of; members of congress, senate, the president, and vice president as well as setting a minimum rate for Whitehouse staff members.

Article

Section 1.

No person who has served 8 terms as a Representative shall be eligible for election to the House of Representatives. For purposes of this section, the election of a person to fill a vacancy in the House of Representatives shall be included as 1 term in determining the number of terms that such person has served as a Representative if the person fills the vacancy for more than 1 year.

Section 2.

No person who has served 2 terms as a Senator shall be eligible for election or appointment to the Senate. For purposes of this section, the election or appointment to the senate. For purposes of this section, the election or appointment of a person to fill a vacancy in the Senate shall be included as 1 term in determining the number of terms that such person has served as a Senator if the person fills the vacancy for more than 3 years.

Section 3.

On this day the Presidential salary shall be set at an annual rate of 1 million dollars plus taxes, the Vice-presidential salary will be set at 3 quarters of the presidential salary plus taxes, the house and senate will be set at half that of the presidential salary plus taxes, and the minimum salary for members of Whitehouse staff shall be one tenth that of the presidential salary plus taxes unless waved completely by that staff member. Withstanding these adjustments all confederacies between those mentioned shall be dissolved and disallowed. Cabinet salary is to be adjusted to one fifth of the presidential salary plus taxes. For those members of the house of representatives currently exceeding the term limits one more term is allowable. For all current holders of office salary adjustments extend to their election.
